### **Political Candidates Forum for Dallas, Denton and Collin Counties**

Dallas – Candidates for elected positions serving Dallas, Denton and Collin Counties will participate in a moderated forum sponsored by North Dallas Suburban Alumnae Chapter (NDSA) of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. The Candidates Forum will be held at the First Baptist Church of Hamilton Park Family Life Center, 210 Abrams Road, Richardson, TX 75081 on Tuesday, October 11<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM.

The nonpartisan event is free, open to the public, and designed to give voters an opportunity to hear from candidates running for state and local offices in the areas serving Far North Dallas and suburban communities including Addison, Carrollton, Farmers Branch, Garland, Plano, and Richardson, TX. The forum will be moderated by Ms. Kristi Nelson, NBC 5 First at Four, Lone Star Politics and 5 Talk Street Anchor and Reporter, and will include questions from the audience.
